I would like to give praise to our wonderful Lord and Savior who has allowed this Ministry to be the instrument used in 281 professions of faith in 2003.

- Became a full time ministry
- Preached in local churches
- Increased services from 12 to 18 a month
- Recruited two volunteer Bible teachers

Jail and Prison Ministry

Nursing Homes/Assisted Living

24 of our 281 professions of faith last year come from the Nursing Home/Assisted Living Ministry.

1st Sunday in December, First Baptist Church of the Islands Middle School Girls Sunday School Class came to Tara to help us and hand out the lap blankets they made. They made 37 lap blankets with pockets for the Nursing Home Residents. They put Christmas Cards in the pockets so that the residents could send Cards to their family. Everyone was extremely happy to get their gift. At this same service we gave out some of the Christmas Cards the Awana's made. We were able to give out cards at all four Homes we minister at.

December 10th, 22 members of the Calvary Band went over to Tara Nursing Home. They played songs for the residents. Some played solos, and others played in-groups of 3-5. The Christmas Story was read to them, the students mingled and talked with the residents. It was a great time of encouragement and uplifting the residents in the name of Christ.
