20TH ANNIVERSARY

It has been 25 years since the Lord put on my heart to start His Love Ministries. The ministry began in December of 1997 as a part-time endeavor. However, this March 17th will be our 20th anniversary of full-time ministry. I am so thankful that in 2000, God saw fit to remove me from the job I'd been at for 18 years. At the time it was a blow to me, but God is good and had a better plan for me in taking the ministry full-time. He set my mind to His plan. We incorporated the ministry in 2000 and became a 501 (c) 3 nonprofit in 2002, retroactive back to 2000.

Due to God's faithfulness and willingness to use me, as well as your faithfulness to support us, we have seen God do mighty things and reach out to those the world has forgotten. God first led me to go to the prisons in 1997, and then in 1999 we started going to senior care homes. Through the years He has opened many other doors to youth and adults at Coastal Harbor, the jail, youth detention center, transition centers, homeless shelters, truck stops, and facilities for women, children, and veterans who were struggling to make it on their own.

God gave me the name **His Love** because it is only through His love that we can become who He wants us to be as a Child of the King. Before Covid, we were doing as many as 2400+ services a year and now we are down to about a quarter of that. I never imagined a virus would be the thing to remove the preaching of the Gospel from these places, but God is still working and His plan is always best. Pray for us as we partner with others to share the Gospel and seek volunteers willing to go to the forgotten. Our plan is to follow the Lord wherever He leads us until He sees fit to quit using us or provides someone to take over this ministry when I can no longer do it. We are so thankful for all of you who pray and support us; many of you have been from the very beginning and are still with us today. God knows who you are, and as a partner in this ministry you will reap the rewards, because you have played a part in every life that has been changed. Thank You and God Bless You.



COASTAL HARBOR

Lawrence, Esther, and I held bible study when an older boy (who had previously attended without fail) told us he was leaving the facility to live with his brother. Afterwards, he stayed behind to speak with us (as he often did) and told us that he thought he had been a Christian before, but now he knew he was a Christian because of the ministry. He said that the services had helped him grow greatly in his faith and cleared up some misunderstandings. We had a special time of prayer and after blessing Him, he returned the blessing with his own heartfelt prayer asking God to continue to use the ministry to help the other boys. That is our prayer and hope it is yours as well. We gave our farewells to him with much encouragement, and he was visibly touched by Esther's tearful goodbye.

One of the boys made a special request just before Christmas: a leather-bound Bible for the boys who attended regularly. It was hard to say no because he has always been extremely thoughtful and kind every time we came. Once when some of the boys outside the room were trying to disrupt our service by yelling obscenities, he was quick to condemn their behavior and apologized to us on their behalf. It is also clear he has an unusual grasp on scripture for someone his age. One visit, I found him at the feet of a Christian staff member seemingly being comforted by her. She told me that the day before the boy had prayed for everyone, and it was one of the most touching prayers she had ever heard. He and another boy demonstrated above-average spiritual aptitude and the desire to know God's word. So, we honored his request and presented each of the two boys leather-bound study Bibles that will help them better understand the word of God.

At one unit, an older boy often confronts me when we arrive, challenging what I know about the Islamic faith. The only time he attended a service, he and two other boys were so disruptive we had to have them removed. During most of our services he prowls outside the locked door in attempts to disrupt us, sometimes getting other boys to join him. When we arrived on Christmas day with gifts he asked, "are those for everybody?" We told him they were, and he asked, "Me too?" We told him, "Yes, you too." He and all the boys on the unit politely listened to our short Christmas message. On our next visit, he seemed to have softened towards us, not creating any disturbance. We left the door open and he prowled the hall but did not create any disturbance. I believe this boy is spiritually curious, so please pray the Holy Spirit will steer him back into a service to hear the good news of Jesus Christ.
